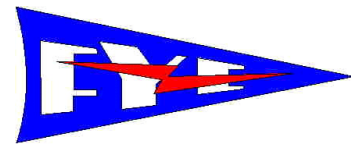

Dock Bidding Results

The January bid cycle resulted in two new assignments and one member moving to a different location, leaving the previous space available. See the list at right for dock spaces available for the February bid cycle. This month's bid cycle will end permanent assignment placements for the 2012 season. More spaces may become available in the coming months as some members have boats for sale. Those spaces will be made available for temporary seasonal assignments and second boat contracts.

For your convenience, we have an online Dock Space Assignment Bid Form. Access to this form is available at www.fordyachtclub.com. Click on the forms link – lower left corner. You must have a member password to make an online bid. (See your monthly bill for login instructions) The yellow dock space bid form cards are also available in the Clubhouse lobby, just outside the office door if you wish to use that method.

As we process bids, we consider the actual length and beams of boats, not catalog or advertised dimensions. As specified in the Bylaws, bowsprits, swim platforms and all types of hardware extensions are included in boat length. Please indicate on your bid form where your boat is located in the FYC yard, or elsewhere if that is the case, so our committee can find it for measuring.

As a Reminder:

It is Club policy that if a member does not participate in the dock bidding process, they will not be eligible for a temporary assignment along the "H" wall for the 2012 season. Utilization of all other dock spaces in both harbors is first priority. If there are no compatible spaces available this month, you must submit a bid form indicating that there are no compatible spaces up for bid. One bid of this type is sufficient for all subsequent months unless a compatible space becomes available for bid later during this bidding season. You must bid on it that month to be eligible for assignment to "H" wall even if your bid is not successful.

Members must be in Good Standing on the bid deadline date for bids to be accepted and before boats are launched and moored in an assigned space.

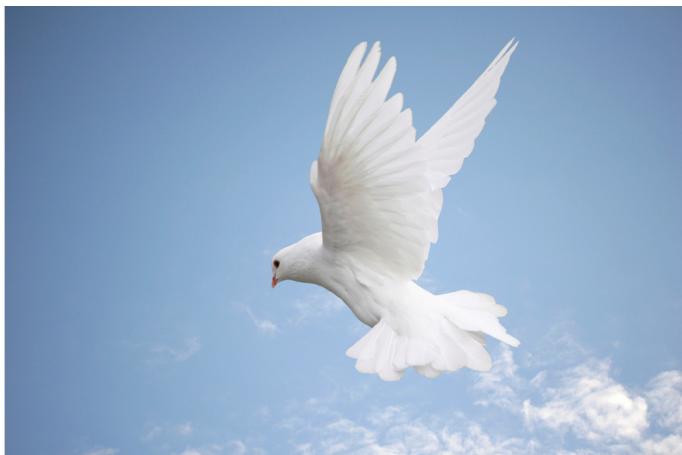
Copies of boat registration and insurance documents must be on file at the FYC Office for valid bids.

Flight of The Dove

Florida to the Exumas 2011 & 12



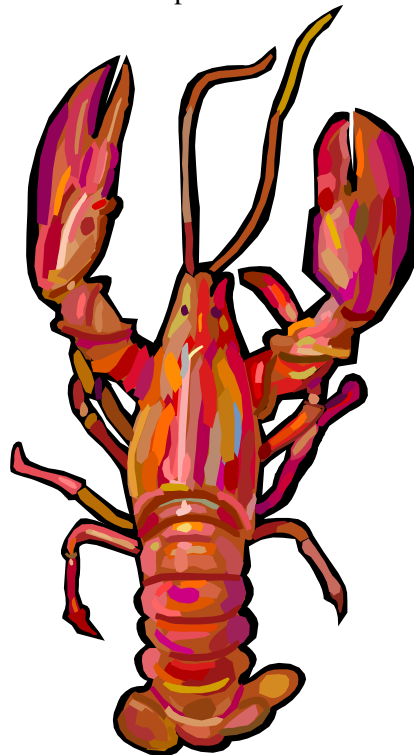
On the 17th of December at 0445 'The Dove' made the move across the Gulfstream to the Bahamas and landed in Nassau at 1000 on December 18. It was an uneventful crossing but only sailed for a total of 4 hrs. It was the first chance in about 2 weeks to get across the Gulfstream, so there were a number of boats that made the crossing that day.

I stayed at the Nassau Harbor Club and checked in with customs and immigration. In Nassau, they come to the marina, which makes checking in much easier. The next week was spent doing boat chores and checking in with family and friends for Christmas. The reason that I stayed in Nassau for over a week was to see the annual Junkanoo celebration. Junkanoo is celebrated on Boxing Day, December 26 and January 1 and starts at midnight.

So after a couple of hours of sleep Christmas evening, 8 of us from the marina took a cab downtown for the celebration. All I can say is wow! The colors, costumes, dancing and music were fantastic. There are a number of groups that compete for a first prize of \$50,000. Each group has its own theme with dancers, costumes, floats and musicians. All the costumes have to be made of paper. The music consists of a brass section followed by the cow bells and then the goat skin drums. It was very interesting and a lot of fun.

After getting back to the boat at 0400 and getting a couple hours sleep, I departed for Normans Cay in the Exumas. I spent the next few days there snorkeling and walking the island, waiting out a cold front with winds out of the northwest. Then it was on to Warderick Wells and the Exuma Park. This is where I welcomed in the New Year. The Park Warden invited everyone in the mooring field to a little get-together on the beach at sunset. We all brought an appetizer and the Warden supplied ham, mac & cheese and slaw. Met some new friends and had a good time.

On New Year's day, 'The Dove' moved about 20 miles south to Pipe Creek. This is one of the best-protected anchorages in the Exumas. The next day, I heard there was a cruisers' regatta and rowed the dinghy the 3 miles to see the start and ended up as part of the race committee. The winner of the race was the local champion Bahamian sloop called *Tida Wave*.



The following weekend, one of the other cruisers in Pipe Creek invited me to go hunt for lobsters and I got my first two lobsters with a pole spear. There is nothing better than fresh lobster for dinner. In two days, I got myself 4 lobsters. I had a chance for a couple more but my freezer was full! Now, it's on to the Black Point for laundry, fresh bread and Internet at Lorain's Café. After that 'The Dove' will slowly move south to George Town.
