From the Chairman...

Hopefully, by the time this newsletter gets to you, the dredging will be done and the refurbishing of the grounds well underway. I hope you've been able to follow the progress on the bulletin board in the clubhouse or website. Peter Murray is applying for a maintenance permit to allow us to clean up what might have been missed by the dredging company this year. The present permit expires December 31, 2001.

The permit to put riprap on Round Island to keep the lake from washing away the harbor protection along the East Basin entrance has been approved. Dan Mills is in the process of obtaining bids to get this work done. This project will need to be done next year.

The capital improvement projects approved at the May Board of Directors meeting are:

- New buoys for entrances - \$2000.00 This will put four buoys at each entrance.
- Pavers for the seawall - \$1200.00, enough to do the rest of the walkways
- Start lawn sprinkler system - \$6200.00 (up to max)
- Reserve for unexpected - \$2000.00

This brings the total capital improvement spending to approximately \$21,800.00 for 2001.

Some of the projects we are looking for members to help out with this year are:

- Installation of the lawn sprinkler system,
- Painting the seawall and
- Clearing along the Round Island side of the East Basin.

Following is a proposed change to the Bylaws-appendix VI.... Multipurpose Room Rules, number 2

Power Fleet Captains Note

June 22, 23, and 24 there will be a poker run to Cooley Canal Yacht Club. The following, is a summary of some the main requirements for the poker runs:

- 1- You need to attend a poker run by boat a minimum of **four hours to receive a poker card.**
- 2- You need to attend **all of the poker runs by boat and attend a minimum of eight hours at each run to receive a flag**
- 3- This year there will be a poker run at Elba-Mar. This means if you attend a poker run before and after Elba-Mar you are eligible to get poker card and not go to Elba-Mar by boat.
- 4- If a low water condition exists at any of the clubs, as called by the host club, you will get credit for the poker run providing that you attended the poker runs before and after.

Whether you attend a poker run by car or boat, you need to let me or my designated representative log you into the AYC Poker Run Log Book. Mike Gratz has agreed to be my representative when I cannot make it to a poker run. Also, let Mike or I know if you attend by car and how many people attended with you. All Ford Yacht Club members are encouraged to attend as many poker runs as possible. Have a safe trip and please fill out a float plan for the Harbor Master.
